### JBBA NATIONAL JUNIOR ANIMAL SHOW RULES

### **Qualifications of Exhibitor**

- 1. Must be a member of the Junior Beefmaster Breeders Association (JBBA).
- 2. Must register for Convention and pay both registration and entry fees. (All fees are non-refundable.)
- 3. Each exhibitor should have continually and personally fed and cared for their heifer(s) under the direct supervision of a County Agent, Vo-Ag instructor and/or his or her parents.
- 4. Entries must be exhibited by the owner unless he or she owns two or more entries in the same class, whereupon another bona fide JBBA exhibitor may show one of the entries. If the entry is a pair, the cow must be exhibited by the owner.
- 5. Any JBBA exhibitor who is a qualified entrant to show and cannot, due to illness or injury while attending the show, may have their entry shown by another bona fide JBBA exhibitor.
- 6. Exhibitors must be a minimum of six years old on January 1st of the year of the show.
- 7. All contestants shall be broken into three divisions for the Contests. The Junior Division shall be those who are 10 years of age and younger on or before December 31, 2015. The Intermediate Division shall be those between the ages of 11 and 14 on or before December 31, 2015. The Senior Division shall be those who are 15 years of age on or before December 31, 2015 and up to the maximum age limit stated in the JBBA Bylaws.
  - Article I, Bylaw 1 states: "Junior members shall be elected to junior membership by the Board of Directors and shall be under the age of twenty-one (21) years on January 1st of the current year."

### Dog Rule

If at any JBBA event, a dog or personal pet is considered a problem, disruption, and/or not properly controlled or handled by the owner or person responsible for said animal, a JBBA director, adult advisory committee person, or show official can be notified and in response to notification, have the authority to request that said dog or personal pet be immediately removed from the premises. If you have dogs or personal pets that travel with you, please be considerate of other exhibitors and their cattle.

### **Qualifications of Animals**

- 1. Official Interstate Health Certificates must accompany all cattle and must be presented to a representative of the show at the time the cattle arrive on the show premises. Usual state and interstate brucellosis and tuberculosis requirements will apply. Every animal at the 2016 JBBA National Show must have an official health certificate verified by a licensed veterinarian within 30 days of the show and must meet state animal health commission requirements of hosting state. THIS SHOW IS AN INTERSTATE (ACCEPTING ANIMALS FROM OTHER STATES) SHOW FOR LIVESTOCK ENTRIES. EXHIBITORS WITH LIVESTOCK ORIGINATING OUTSIDE THE STATE OF LOUISIANA ARE ENCOURAGED TO CONTACT THEIR STATE ANIMAL HEALTH OFFICIALS TO CONFIRM SPECIFIC REQUIREMENTS, IF ANY; THEIR STATE MAY IMPOSE ON ANIMALS RETURNING FROM A LOUISIANA SHOW. EXHIBITORS NEED TO BRING 2 COPIES OF THEIR HEALTH PAPERS.
- 2. Original BBU Certificates of Breeding (not copies) on each animal shown, including any calf-at-side, must be presented to a representative of the show at the time the cattle arrive on the premises. Application for a BBU Certificate of Breeding on calves under 30 days of age must be presented. Official scramble registration papers with appropriate show stamp must be presented at check-in.

- 3. All heifers and bulls must be registered with Beefmaster Breeders United as a purebred and out of a BBU-Certified Purebred dam, Second Cross dam or as otherwise stated in the BBU By-Laws. Advancer and E6 heifers must be registered with Beefmaster Breeders United.
- 4. All cattle may be inspected to ensure that all identification numbers and holding brands branded or tattooed on the animal and the description match identically with the BBU Certificate of Breeding. The top 5 placing heifers in the owned heifer show, as well as the top 2 placing animals in the bred and owned heifers, bred and owned bulls, and E6/Advancer heifers, will have their identification checked by BBU staff at the conclusion of their class. Any animal whose identification does not match their registration certificate will be disgualified from the show.
- 5. All cattle must have been owned by the entrant a minimum of 60 days prior to the show (May 22, 2016). Evidence of ownership is indicated by the date of sale on the registration certificate.
- 6. Joint ownership, when both owners are JBBA members, will be accepted. However, an animal(s) must be entered and exhibited in the name of one of the owners. Joint ownership consisting of parent-youth or a combination of adult and youth will not be eligible.

### 7. BEGINNING JANUARY 1, 2018 (FOR FUTURE REFERENCE)

- a. JBBA members are allowed to have partnership animals with another JBBA member (animals owned by parent-youth or adult-youth combinations are not eligible). However, multiple owned cattle will not be allowed to show at any JBBA show. The animal being entered must be registered in the sole name of the junior showing the animal 60 days prior to show date as evidenced by the date of sale on the heifer's registration certificate. Partnerships of any form will not be allowed to show.
- b. In the case of a bred & owned show, joint ownership of the dam is permitted; however, for offspring to qualify as a JBBA Bred & Owned animal, all owners of the dam must be JBBA members, except in the case of siblings where one sibling has become too old for JBBA membership, joint ownership is acceptable as long as the older sibling was a JBBA member and has maintained continuous uninterrupted memberhship in the BBU since the expiration of their JBBA membership as determined by the BBU office. On or after January 1, 2018, all animals being exhibited at a JBBA approved show must be single owned. No partnership animals will be allowed to be shown.
- 8. There is no limit to the number of heifers and or bulls an exhibitor may enter.
- 9. Heifers/Bulls that do not show the day of month of birth on their BBU Certificate of Breeding shall be considered to be born on the first day of that month.
- 10. All BBU registered animals must be shown with their hair coats lying downward and flat against their entire body. Hair trimming is permissible and must be done in those few areas such as the neck and portions of the topline of the animal which may not lay flat against the body. Hair may not be trained upwards or forwards and/or pulled upwards or forwards on any part of the animal's body. No animals may have any foreign object(s) attached to it in any manner or have its natural color altered in a manner so as to change the conformation or appearance. An exhibitor who fails to abide by this rule will be dismissed from the arena and/or forfeit premiums, awards and points from the show.
- Any heifer and or bull that, in the opinion of the designated BBU official, would be a detriment to the breed shall be removed from the show, regardless of any prior classification. Examples would be animals exhibiting signs of low fertility, genetic or physical defects.
- 12. Any uncontrollable animal will be dismissed from the ring at the discretion of the judge or show official/coordinator.



- 13. **Substitutions** will be allowed up to **July 19**, **2016**, **4:00 p.m.**, provided the substitution animal meets all other requirements and rules. There will be a substitution fee of \$25 per animal.
- To be eligible for Bred and Owned Show awards, *exhibitors must present an original Bred- and-Owned certificate at time of check-in*. Bred-and-Owned certificates may be obtained by contacting the BBU office and providing the registration number. Joint ownership, when both members are the breeder of record, will be accepted.
  - i. Joint ownership of the dam is permitted; however, for offspring to qualify as a JBBA Bred & Owned animal, all owners of the dam must be JBBA members, except in the case of siblings where one sibling has become too old for JBBA membership, joint ownership is acceptable as long as the older sibling was a JBBA member and has maintained continuous uninterrupted membership in the BBU since the expiration of their JBBA membership as determined by the BBU office.
- All heifers, two (2) years and older on the day of the show must be palpated safe in calf by a licensed veterinarian and so state on the health certificate, with the exception of heifers nursing their BBU registered natural calf-at-side (under 6 months of age), in which case the heifer may show open. Heifers that do not show the day of month on their BBU Certificate of Breeding shall be considered to be born on the first day of that month.
- 16. Heifers two (2) years and older on the day shown whose calf has died cannot be shown.
- 17. A class may be split at the discretion of the show official/coordinator. Every effort will be made to split classes on a monthly basis.
- 18. \*\*Pair Classes: To be eligible to show in the pair classes, all heifers MUST HAVE their BBU registered haltered calf at side.

### 20. <u>Bred-and-Owned Heifer Show</u>

- **a.** Heifer(s) must be entered in the National Show to compete (Cannot only enter Bred-and-Owned Show).
- b. All heifers must have Bred-and-Owned certificate. To be eligible for the Bred-and-Owned Show awards, exhibitors must present an original Bred-and-Owned certificate at time of check-in. Bred-and-Owned certificates may be obtained by contacting the BBU office and providing the registration number. Owners of Bred-and-Owned animals are defined as follows:
  - i. Breeder- That individual, corporation or firm who owned the dam at the time of conception of the animal in question.
  - ii. Owner That individual, corporation or firm who owned the dam at the time of birth of the animal in question.
  - iii. JBBA members entering a Bred and Owned animal must have had the dam of said animal in their name prior to conception of said animal, regardless of how conception was made and own said dam at the time of animal's birth. Animals produced from purchased or transferred embryos cannot be considered bred and owned animals.
  - iv. Joint ownership of the dam is permitted; however, for offspring to qualify as a JBBA Bred & Owned animal, all owners of the dam must be JBBA members, except in the case of siblings where one sibling has become too old for JBBA membership, joint ownership is acceptable as long as the older sibling was a JBBA member and has maintained continuous uninterrupted membership in the BBU since the expiration of their JBBA membership as determined by the BBU office.
- c. You may enter as many heifers as you want (no limit).
- d. \$15 entry fee per animal (Late fee \$30 per animal).
- e. Not a mandatory show but, must enter at least one heifer in order to get points for Bredand-Owned in All-Around competition.

A. The exhibitor of the Champion Bred-and-Owned Heifer will have his/her name placed on the Bred-and-Owned trophy which will be kept in the possession of the winner until the next year's National Junior Heifer Show. An individual who has the Champion Bred-and-Owned at the National Junior Heifer Show three (3) times will retire the trophy. In addition, the exhibitor of the Champion Bred-and-Owned Heifer will be eligible for an accumulating cash award if the heifer is a product of the JBBA A. I. Program. The cash award will be in the amount of \$100 with an additional \$100 added each year until the award is won, at which time it will start over the next year at \$100. The exhibitor of the Champion Bred-and-Owned Heifer will also receive a semen tank.

### JBBA TOP HAND AWARD

This award is similar to BBU Breeder of the Year Award, will recognize the JBBA member that participates in JBBA and BBU programs and is involved in building their herd and marketing their cattle. Showing cattle is not a criteria for this awards and all JBBA members are eligible. Applications are available on the BBU website or by calling the office. ### 22. <u>JBBA ULTRASOUND CARCASS SHOW</u>

The JBBA Ultrasound Carcass Class was designed to help educate JBBA members and parents about the importance of collecting and submitting performance data on their Beefmaster cattle. Proper age for animals to be scanned is between 320 and 550 days of age. Animals ultrasounded less than 320 days and more than 550 days of age will not be included in the BBU database for EPD calculations. Any animal is eligible to be scanned however animals that fall within the proper age break are only eligible for awards.

### **Rules**

- a. Animals must be entered in the National Show to compete.
- b. All animals must be within the Age window for Ultrasound data collection of 320-550 days of age. (September 3, 2015- January 17, 2015)
- c. Ultrasound carcass class is open to both heifers and bulls. You may enter as many animals as you want (no limit).
- d. \$15 entry fee per animal.
- e. Not a mandatory show. You do not have to enter in order to participate in the JBBA all-around competition.
- f. Exhibitor must walk their animal through to collect scan data on.
- g. Classes will be determined according to the number of entries and will be broken into age appropriate classes (i.e. 90 days or less if possible depending on numbers entered)
- h. Ultrasound data will be collected by an Ultrasound Guidelines Council (UGC) certified technician or data may also be collected by a UGC chute side technician (someone that has passed both the field certification and the lab certification on the BIA Pro System).
- i. All data will be RAW and collected by a chute-side certified tech so that the software can interpret the collected images.
- j. Data will be processed through a Beefmaster friendly grid formula (selected by BBU staff) to determine a dollar value for each entry.
- k. Each class will be ranked according to carcass value and awards will be presented within each class.

- I. If your animals have previously been scanned and data has been sent to the BBU office you may still enter the ultrasound carcass class.
- m. Previous scan data will not be used for ultrasound carcass class. All animals must be scanned during the Ultrasound Carcass class at the 2016 Nationals. Animals will be scanned by ages.
- n. Awards will be presented for all class winners.

**NOTE:** If you choose to have your animal scanned, but do not enter the carcass contest, you are responsible for providing the necessary paperwork. You will need to contact Collin Osbourn in the BBU office to get a "barn sheet" to be able to report the scan data on your animals. You will also be subject to any fees the ultrasound technician may charge to scan your additional animals.

### **GENERAL INFORMATION**

- Entry deadline for Nationals is <u>JUNE 3, 2016.</u>
   All Entries and Pre-Registrations including all money must be received not post marked at the JBBA office no later than this date or you will pay the late animal entry & convention registration fees. Late entries are not guaranteed a 2016 JBBA National T-Shirt.
   THIS WILL BE STRICTLY ENFORCED WITH NO EXCEPTIONS!
- 2. Registration fees include meals throughout the week including the banquet for one person. JBBA members will receive a 2016 JBBA National t-shirt. Adults wanting to purchase a 2016 JBBA National's t-shirt are welcome to. Limited meal and banquet tickets will be available throughout the week. Adults are encouraged to pay registration fee or pre order individual meal tickets.
- 3. All applications for entry must be submitted on official JBBA forms in accordance with instructions for same. All entry forms must be signed by JBBA member.
- 4. Check in Process- Exhibitors will not need to bring animal(s) to check- in. For check-in you must have the following:
  - a. health papers (with palpation status, if applicable)
  - b. registration papers
  - c. bred and owned certificates (if applicable)
  - d. bull breeding soundness exam (if applicable)
- 5. The tattoo or brand will be checked on the top five (5) placing heifers, top two (2) placing Bred and Owned Bulls, Bred and Owned Heifers, and E6/Advancer Heifers at the conclusion of each class and must match the permanent ID that appears on the original registration paper. It is the member's responsibility to ensure that the brand or tattoo is legible prior to arrival on the show grounds. Members will be disqualified if their animal does not have a matching tattoo or brand, or if the tattoo or brand is illegible. In the event of a disqualification, the next placing animal with matching identification will advance. Reminder that calves that show on the side of a cow must have permanent identification number.
- 6. All protests must be filed within one (1) hour after the completion of the National Heifer Show on July 22, 2016, with a \$250 fee. If the protest is upheld, the \$250 fee will be refunded. All protests will be reviewed and resolved by the BBU Junior Program Committee and Junior Board members if available.
- 7. The Grand Champion and Reserve Grand Champion Heifer, Grand Champion and Reserve Champion Bred and Owned Heifer and Grand and Reserve Grand Champion Bred and Owned Bull at the JBBA National Show will have tail hair collected from them for potential future DNA



- sampling.
- 8. Failure to comply with these rules or failure to cooperate with the show and breed officials will be grounds for removal.
- 9. Reminder to all JBBA members and parents that it is your responsibility to make sure that you are on time for your class. Once the class has started being judged it is up to the judge and show official on whether or not to allow you in the ring. We will not hold the class up for you.
- 10. No alcohol consumption shall take place inside of the lke Hamilton Exposition Center.
- 11. All heifers and bulls must be in place and checked in by show officials by 4:00 p.m., July 19, 2016. Animals entered in the Ultrasound Performance Class must on the grounds and checked in by 8:00 am on Tuesday, July 19, 2016.
- 12. No animal may be removed from the show grounds prior to one hour (1) hour following the completion of the show, unless the animal is released prior to that time pursuant to a written release signed by the show coordinator. Any animal involved in a protest shall remain on show grounds until the protest is resolved. Owners of animals not removed by 11:00 a.m. on July 23, 2016 will be fined \$50 per animal.
- 13. Substitutions will be allowed up to July 19, 2016, 4:00 p.m., provided the substitution animal meets all other requirements and rules. There will be a substitution fee of \$25 per animal.
- 14. All exhibitors are encouraged to bring a wheelbarrow to help contain waste.
- 15. Stalling-Insofar as possible, shelter will be provided for all animals. JBBA does not charge a stall fee and does not guarantee stall space to any entry. Tie space is soil & cement. Shavings must be purchased from the lke Hamilton Expo Center. Cost of shavings will be \$7.25/bag. Please have correct cash or a check.
- 16. A show supply vendor will be on the grounds to sell supplies Wednesday, Thursday, and Friday.
- 17. Nurse cows, recipient cows, retired show heifers with calves, etc., will not be allowed on the show grounds. The only cows allowed on the show grounds will be those entered in a class themselves. Bulls entered in the Bred & Owned Bull show will be in an area, to be designated upon arrival, provided the JBBA Member has paid the entry fee(s) with the owner responsible for care of his/her entry.
- 18. All premium money that has not been claimed 90 days after the first issue date of the checks will be forfeited.
- 19. Points shall be awarded as follows for all contests, (except Photography Contest and Power Point Contest), Heifer Show, Bred and Owned Bull Show, E6/Advancer Heifer Show, Ultrasound Carcass Show, and Bred-and-Owned Show.

- a. In the case of a tie in a contest, all involved in a tie will be given the highest placing points for the purpose of all-around competition. Example: If 4 members tie for 3<sup>rd</sup> place in a contest, all 4 will receive 40 points.
- b. For the purpose of determining placings for awards, tie breakers questions will be used. Example: 2 members tie for 3<sup>rd</sup> place in the quiz bowl. Member A correctly answers the first tie breaker question, while Member B answers it incorrectly.  Conference even if they do not seek Board election. 50 points towards the All-Around scores will
 be awarded for <u>attending the entire Conference</u>. Board candidates will be interviewed on
 Monday, July 18, 2016 at 1:00 p.m.

### II. JBBA Board of Officers and Directors

### XII. HALTERED BULL SHOW

• For a Bull to be eligible, he must be:

- Born from March 31, 2016 September 1, 2014
- Bull must be Bred & Owned by the exhibitor
- Any bull exhibited must have a nose lead (temporary or permanent) with a lead strap attached to it.
- Each Beefmaster bull eighteen (18) months of age or older must have passed a fertility examination given by a licensed veterinarian and the results of the examination must be presented at check-in. Once a bull has a positive examination, retesting is not required.
- Any entry that is unruly and poses danger to other exhibitors, or if exhibitor loses control of their animal twice during the class, the animal will be dismissed from the show arena by the judge or arena director or designee.
- If an exhibitor doesn't receive the 25 points from the Bred & Owned heifer show, that exhibitor may receive those points when he/she exhibits his/her Bred & Owned bull.

### XIII. ADVANCER/E6 HEIFER SHOW RULES

- 1. Heifers must be either registered BBU Advancers or E6 heifers to compete.
- 2. Exhibitors will abide by all JBBA rules for the Advancer/E6 Heifer Show.
- 3. If you have a purebred Beefmaster female with either an Advancer or E6 calf at side you will show in the Advancer/E6 Heifer Show Only.
- 4. All BBU registered animals, including Advancer and E6 Heifers, must be shown with their hair coats lying downward and flat against their entire body. Hair trimming is permissible and must be done in those few areas such as the neck and portions of the topline of the animal which may not lay flat against the body. Hair may not be trained upwards or forwards and/or pulled upwards or forwards on any part of the animal's body. No animals may have any foreign object(s) attached to it in any manner or have its natural color altered in a manner so as to change the conformation or appearance. An exhibitor who fails to abide by this rule will be dismissed from the arena and/or forfeit premiums, awards and points from the show.
- 5. All heifers, two (2) years and older on the day of the show must be palpated safe in calf by a licensed veterinarian and so state on the health certificate, with the exception of heifers nursing their BBU registered natural calf-at-side (under 6 months of age). Heifers that do not show the day of month on their BBU Certificate shall be considered to be born on the first day of that month.
- 6. If you have a Registered Advancer dam, (less than 87.5% Beefmaster) with a Certified, Registered Beefmaster Calf (87.5% Beefmaster or greater), the pair will show in the Advancer Heifer Show.
