JBBA NATIONAL JUNIOR HEIFER SHOW RULES

Qualifications of Exhibitor

- 1. Must be a member of the Junior Beefmaster Breeders Association (JBBA).
- 2. Must register for Convention and pay fees. (All fees are non-refundable.)
- 3. Each exhibitor should have continually and personally fed and cared for their heifer(s) under the direct supervision of a County Agent, Vo-Ag instructor and/or his or her parents.
- 4. Entries must be exhibited by the owner unless he or she owns two or more entries in the same class, whereupon another bona fide JBBA exhibitor may show one of the entries. If the entry is a pair, the cow must be exhibited by the owner.
- 5. Any JBBA exhibitor who is a qualified entrant to show and cannot, due to illness or injury while attending the show, may have their entry shown by another bona fide JBBA exhibitor.
- 6. Exhibitors must be a minimum of six years old on January 1st of the year of the show.
- 7. All contestants shall be broken into three divisions for the Contests. The Junior Division shall be those who are 10 years of age and younger on or before December 31, 2012. The Intermediate Division shall be those between the ages of 11 and 14 on or before December 31, 2012. The Senior Division shall be those who are 15 years of age on or before December 31, 2012 and up to the maximum age limit stated in the JBBA Bylaws.
 - Article I, Bylaw 1 states: "Junior members shall be elected to junior membership by the Board of Directors and shall be under the age of twenty-one (21) years on January 1st of the current year."

Dog Rule

If at any JBBA event, a dog or personal pet is considered a problem, disruption, and/or not properly controlled or handled by the owner or person responsible for said animal, a JBBA director, adult advisory committee person, or show official can be notified and in response to notification, have the authority to request that said dog or personal pet be immediately removed from the premises. If you have dogs or personal pets that travel with you, please be considerate of other exhibitors and their cattle.

Qualifications of Animals

- 1. Official Interstate Health Certificates must accompany all cattle and must be presented to a representative of the show at the time the cattle arrive on the show premises. Each heifer must be tested for T.B. and Brucellosis in accordance with federal and state regulations. Such tests must be made by a federally accredited laboratory. THIS SHOW IS AN INTERSTATE (ACCEPTING ANIMALS FROM OTHER STATES) SHOW FOR LIVESTOCK ENTRIES. EXHIBITORS WITH LIVESTOCK ORIGINATING OUTSIDE THE STATE OF TEXAS ARE ENCOURAGED TO CONTACT THEIR STATE ANIMAL HEALTH OFFICIALS TO CONFIRM SPECIFIC REQUIREMENTS, IF ANY; THEIR STATE MAY IMPOSE ON ANIMALS RETURNING FROM A TEXAS SHOW. EXHIBITORS NEED TO BRING 2 COPIES OF THEIR HEALTH PAPERS, ONE FOR JBBA AND ONE FOR TAHC. EXHIBITORS WILL KEEP THE ORIGINAL
- 2. Original BBU Certificates of Breeding (not copies) on each animal shown, including any calf-at-side, must be presented to a representative of the show at the time the cattle arrive on the premises. Application for a BBU Certificate of Breeding on calves under 30 days of age must be presented. Official scramble registration papers with appropriate show stamp must be presented at check-in.



- 3. All heifers must be registered with Beefmaster Breeders United as a purebred and out of a BBU-Certified Purebred dam, Second Cross dam or as otherwise stated in the BBU By-Laws.
- 4. All cattle shall be inspected to ensure that all identification numbers and holding brands branded or tattooed on the animal and the description match identically with the BBU Certificate of Breeding.
- 5. All cattle must have been owned by the entrant a minimum of 60 days prior to the show, May 27, 2013. Evidence of ownership is indicated by the date of sale on the registration certificate.
- 6. Joint ownership, when both owners are JBBA members, will be accepted. However, an animal(s) must be entered and exhibited in the name of one of the owners. Joint ownership consisting of parent-youth or a combination of adult and youth will not be eligible.
- 7. There is no limit to the number of heifers an exhibitor may enter.
- 8. Heifers that do not show the day of month of birth on their BBU Certificate of Breeding shall be considered to be born on the first day of that month.
- 9. All BBU registered animals must be shown with their hair coats lying downward and flat against their entire body. Hair trimming is permissible and must be done in those few areas such as the neck and portions of the topline of the animal which may not lay flat against the body. Hair may not be trained upwards or forwards and/or pulled upwards or forwards on any part of the animal's body. No animals may have any foreign object(s) attached to it in any manner or have its natural color altered in a manner so as to change the conformation or appearance. An exhibitor who fails to abide by this rule will be dismissed from the arena and/or forfeit premiums, awards and points from the show.
- 10. Any heifer that, in the opinion of the designated BBU official, would be a detriment to the breed shall be removed from the show, regardless of any prior classification. Examples would be heifers exhibiting signs of low fertility, genetic or physical defects.
- 11. Any uncontrollable animal will be dismissed from the ring at the discretion of the judge or show official/coordinator.
- 12. **Substitutions** will be allowed up to **July 25**, **2013**, **9:00** a.m., provided the substitution animal meets all other requirements and rules. There will be a substitution fee of \$25 per animal.
- To be eligible for Bred and Owned Show awards, *exhibitors must present an original Bred- and-Owned certificate at time of check-in*. Bred-and-Owned certificates may be obtained by contacting the BBU office and providing the registration number. Joint ownership, when both members are the breeder of record, will be accepted.
- 14. All heifers, two (2) years and older on the day of the show must be palpated safe in calf by a licensed veterinarian and so state on the health certificate, with the exception of heifers nursing their BBU registered natural calf-at-side (under 6 months of age), in which case the heifer may show open. Heifers that do not show the day of month on their BBU Certificate of Breeding shall be considered to be born on the first day of that month.
- 15. A class may be split at the discretion of the show official/coordinator. Every effort will be made to split classes on a monthly basis.
- 16. Heifers two (2) years and older on the day shown whose calf has died cannot be shown.
- 17. **Pair Classes: To be eligible to show in the pair classes, all heifers MUST HAVE their BBU registered haltered calf at side.

19. Bred-and-Owned Heifer Show

- a. Heifer(s) must be entered in the National Show to compete (Cannot only enter Bred-and-Owned Show).
- b. All heifers must have Bred-and-Owned certificate. To be eligible for the Bred-and-Owned Show awards, exhibitors must present an original Bred-and-Owned certificate at time of check-in. Bred-and-Owned certificates may be obtained by contacting the BBU office and providing the registration number. Owners of Bred-and-Owned animals are defined as follows:
 - i. Breeder- That individual, corporation or firm who owned the dam at the time of conception of the animal in question.
 - **ii.** Owner That individual, corporation or firm who owned the dam at the time of birth of the animal in question.
- c. You may enter as many heifers as you want (no limit).
- d. \$15 entry fee per animal (Late fee \$30 per animal).
- e. Not a mandatory show but, must enter at least one heifer in order to get points for Bredand-Owned in All-Around competition.

- a. *Classes may be changed due to number of entries in each class. The exhibitor of the Champion Bred-and-Owned Heifer will have his/her name placed on the Bred-and-Owned trophy which will be kept in the possession of the winner until the next year's National Junior Heifer Show. An individual who has the Champion Bred-and-Owned at the National Junior Heifer Show three (3) times will retire the trophy. In addition, the exhibitor of the Champion Bred-and-Owned Heifer will be eligible for an accumulating cash award if the heifer is a product of the JBBA A. I. Program. The cash award will be in the amount of \$100 with an additional \$100 added each year until the award is won, at which time it will start over the next year at \$100.
- **b.** The exhibitor of the Champion Bred-and-Owned Heifer will also receive a semen tank.

GENERAL INFORMATION

- Entry deadline for Nationals is <u>JUNE 3, 2013.</u>
 All Entries and Pre-Registrations must be received not post marked at the JBBA office no later than this date or you will pay the late animal entry & convention registration fees.
 THIS WILL BE STRICTLY ENFORCED WITH NO EXCEPTIONS!
- 2. Registration fees include meals throughout the week including the banquet for one person. JBBA members will receive a 2013 JBBA National t-shirt. Adults wanting to purchase a 2013 JBBA National's t-shirt are welcome to. Limited meal and banquet tickets will be available throughout the week. Adults are encouraged to pay registration fee or pre order individual meal tickets.
- 3. All applications for entry must be submitted on official JBBA forms in accordance with instructions for same.
- 4. All protests must be filed by July 27, 2013, 5:00 p.m. with a \$100 fee. If the protest is upheld, the \$100 fee will be refunded. All protests will be reviewed and resolved by the BBU Junior Program Committee and Junior Board members available.
- 5. Failure to comply with these rules or failure to cooperate with the show and breed officials will be grounds for removal.
- 6. All heifers and bulls must be in place and checked in by show officials by 9:00 a.m., July 25, 2013.
- 7. All steers must be in place by 9:00 a.m., July 24, 2013.
- 8. All cattle will be released at 6:00 p.m. on July 27, 2013 and must be off of show grounds by 11:00 a.m. on July 28, 2013. *Owners of animals not removed by 11:00 a.m. on July 28, 2013 will be fined \$50 per animal.*
- 9. Substitutions will be allowed up to **July 25, 2013, 9:00 a.m.**, provided the substitution animal meets all other requirements and rules. There will be a substitution fee of \$25 per animal.
- 10. All exhibitors are encouraged to bring a wheelbarrow to help contain waste.
- 11. Tie space is soil & cement. *Shavings must be purchased from the Brazos County Expo Complex.*
- 12. Nurse cows, recipient cows, retired show heifers with calves, etc., will not be allowed on the show grounds. The only cows allowed on the show grounds will be those entered in a class themselves. Bulls entered in the Bred & Owned Bull show will be in an area, to be designated upon arrival, provided the JBBA Member has paid the entry fee(s) with the owner responsible for care of his/her entry.
- 13. All premium money that has not been claimed 90 days after the first issue date of the checks will be forfeited.



14. Points shall be awarded as follows for <u>All Contests</u>, except Heifer Show and Bred-and-Owned Show.

15. The judge shall be selected by the Junior Activities committee from the official JBBA Approved Judges List. National judges shall not have judged at the National Junior Heifer Show within the past 3 years or at a Class C Show within the past year.

I. LEADERSHIP CONFERENCE

- A two hour Leadership/Personal Development Conference will be held Tuesday, July 23, 2013 at 8:30 a.m. for <u>Intermediate and Senior Division participants only.</u> Anyone wanting to run for a JBBA Board position <u>MUST</u> attend this conference. Any Intermediate or Senior member may attend the Conference even if they do not seek Board election. 50 points towards the All-Around scores will be awarded for <u>attending the entire Conference</u>. Board candidates will be interviewed on Wednesday, July 24, 2013 at 8:30 a.m.
- Junior Division participants may participate in a Leadership Conference on Tuesday, July 23, 2013 at 10:00 a.m. This is NOT mandatory for the all-around participation for Junior Division ONLY.

II. JBBA Board of Officers and Directors

- Anyone that is seeking a position on the board must attend the leadership conference on Tuesday, July 23, 2013 and the JBBA Board Meeting on Tuesday, July 23, 2013.
- All those seeking a board position must submit a director's application. Applications are due by 5:00 p.m. on Tuesday, July 23, 2013.
- If you are elected to the board you must be prepared to raise a minimum of \$1,000 in sponsor money for the following year's nationals and will have to purchase a director's shirt and official dress.

III. EDUCATIONAL CONFERENCE

- Participants will have the opportunity to tour the Rosenthal Meat Science Center on the afternoon of Tuesday, July 23, 2013.
- A light jacket is recommended
- Please register if you plan on attending.

IV. HERDSMAN QUIZ

• There will be three tests, one for Juniors, one for Intermediates and one for Seniors. The Senior Division test will consist of questions taken from the BBU brochures, the Beef Improvement Federation (BIF) Handbook and 2013 BBU Spring Sire Summary. Members wanting this information can find it on the BBU website or contact the BBU office.

V. <u>PUBLIC SPEAKING CONTEST</u> (The public is invited to attend.)

- Rules for all Divisions: Senior & Intermediate Contestants will be required to bring three typewritten, double-spaced copies of their speech (with bibliography) on 8 ½ X 11 white paper to contest check-in. Junior Contestants are required to bring two typewritten, double-spaced copies of their speech on an 8 ½ x 11 white paper to contest check-in.
- 1st Place winners in each age division will give their speech at the Awards Banquet on Saturday night.
- The time limit will be 3-7 minutes for Intermediates and Seniors.

The time limit will be 2-4 minutes for Juniors.

No visual aids. No props.

Notes are acceptable, but the speech is not to be read from notes.

Each judge will be allowed to ask questions after a speech is given and contestants will be scored
on their ability to answer the questions. After each contestant has made his/her presentation, they
will be scored on communication, introduction, body, time and conclusion.

- Photos must be delivered to the BBU office no later than July 15th or you may bring them to Nationals and they are due at Nationals by noon on Tuesday, July 23, 2013.
- Photograph entry must be taken by the junior member who has entered it.
- Entries must be 8x10 or 5x7 photographs mounted on matte board. Absolutely NO FRAMING. On back of matte board entry must include: Name, Age Division, and Address.
- Photos cannot be altered or digitally enhanced in any way.
- Photos must contain Beefmaster cattle and/or related activities.
- Photos become the property of JBBA/BBU and can be used in any Beefmaster publications or promotional activities.
- Judging will concentrate on all aspects of photography.
- Plaques will be awarded to 1st and 2nd place in each division.

VIII. POWERPOINT PRESENTATION

- Only one (1) entry per contestant. All contestants must be member of JBBA.
- You do not have to be entered in JBBA National Heifer Show to participate in contest.
- Presentations must be delivered to the BBU office no later than July 15th or you may bring them
 to Nationals and they are due at Nationals by noon on Tuesday, July 23, 2013.
- Entry must include: Name, Age Division, and Address.
- JBBA members must be the sole designer and the presentation needs to be computer generated.
- Presentations should be 3 -5 minutes.
- Presentation must have at least 2 pictures or clip art that support the idea of the presentation.
- Presentations may include but do not require music, video clip or slide transitions.
- Presentations must relate to JBBA, BBU and or the Beefmaster breed in general.
- Presentations become the property of JBBA/BBU and can be used in any Beefmaster publications or promotional activities.
- Entries submitted must be on the following format: CD-ROM (PC Compatible)
- Presentation will be judged on:
 - 40% Slide Content
 - o 35% Originality
 - o 15% Technical Merit
 - 10% Overall Effect of Presentation
- Plagues will be awarded to 1st and 2nd place in each division.

IX. JBBA Junior Autograph Contest

- Can be any junior member that wants to compete.
- Whoever attains all the required autographs first will receive an award
- Have to be turned in by Thursday dinner so they can be counted.
- The required autograph paper will be available at kick-off luncheon.



X. SHOWMANSHIP CONTEST

- To be eligible for the Showmanship Contest the contestant must be entered in the National Junior Heifer Show and meet all rules for same. The entry fee for the showmanship contest is \$10.00 per contestant.
- Exhibitor must show heifer entered in their name.
- Each contestant must wear the exhibitor number for the heifer they are showing.
- Champion Showmanship winners from each division will compete for an overall champion showmanship award.

 - o This is a serious showmanship contest so bid on who you think will win
 - Anybody is eligible to bid on an exhibitor and remember the more money in the pot the more money you could win.

XIII. NATIONAL JBBA STEER SHOW RULES

The goal of purebred cattle breeders should be to produce seedstock sires for the commercial industry that will improve the overall performance and carcass merits of the cattle. Cattle must first be selected to survive and reproduce in the environment in which they are raised, but following weaning, they must also perform well in the feedlot and hang up a desirable carcass for the packer and provide a pleasurable dining experience for the consumer. Only a handful of JBBA and/or purebred breeders have ever followed their cattle through the feedlot and harvesting phase so they really don't know what they have to offer the commercial producer. Thus, the JBBA steer project allows you to know the performance and carcass characteristics of the cattle you are showing.

SUPERINTENDENT: BBU FIELD SERVICE REPRESENTATIVE (S)

- Steers must be owned by the JBBA member and have DNA RESULTS on file with the BBU Office on or before April 1, of the show year. (Note that it takes approximately 30 days to get results back from the DNA lab.)
- Steers must be born between January 1 and December 31 of the year **prior** to the show year and weigh a minimum of 900 pounds on check in date. Any steer weighing less than 900 pounds will be shown in a prospect steer show but will not be eliqible for overall awards.
- All steers will be weighed and ultra-sounded for carcass data collection (fat thickness, ribeye area and intramuscular fat).



- Each animal will be presented in the showring in its natural conformation. Use of artificial tailheads is not permitted. No artificial filling. The use of a coloring agent, glue or powder is prohibited. Use of these products will result in the immediate disqualification.
- All steers must be out of a registered Beefmaster sire and dam.
- All steers must be stalled in the barns and shall not leave the show grounds or stalling area other than for checking in, ultrasounding or showing. No steer will be permitted to be in the tie outs, parking lot or in the trailer area after checking in for the show.
- Exhibitors must present registration certificates at check-in. Show officials will check the steers' tattoos to ensure they are legible and match the registration papers.
- The ultrasound technician (judge) will not be allowed to judge the haltered steer show.
- All JBBA rules regarding fitting, hair length, etc. will apply to the steer show. Steers must follow the same hair rules as the heifers and bulls.
- All JBBA rules regarding alteration or modification of animal will apply to the steers.
- All General Rules, Regulations, Terms and Conditions for JBBA Shows will apply to this show.

Haltered Steer Show Contest Rules

- 1. Steers must be registered Beefmasters to compete.
- 2. Show officials will break classes by weight. Weight classes will be divided as equally as possible into light, medium and/or heavy. There must be at least six steers in a division to have a weight class break (for example, seven steers could be divided into a class of three lightweights and a class of four heavyweights).
- 3. Ultrasound data will be accessible to the judge, if requested, to place animals in the haltered show.
- 4. Exhibitors that have previously been awarded a scholarship may not receive the same scholarship twice. In the event that an exhibitor whom has already been awarded a scholarship achieves a placing that qualifies for the same award the scholarship will be given to the next highest placing eligible exhibitor.
- 5. Proof of college enrollment must be received by the scholarship coordinator before scholarship monies will be released to the recipient's educational institution of choice. An Official Transcript must be sent to the JBBA office to receive scholarship money.

Awards to be presented:

- 1. Live Animal Show Division Champions and Reserve Champions
- 2. Ultrasound Division Champions & Reserve Champions
- 3. Overall Division Champions and Reserve Champions
- 4. Overall Live Animal Show Champion and Reserve Champion.
- 5. Overall Ultrasound Carcass Champion and Reserve Champion.
- 6. Overall Champion and Overall Reserve Champion.
- All steer exhibitors will be required to compete in a project interview in addition to having all of their animals ultrasounded for carcass composition and showing all of their steers at halter in the show ring. Following is the breakdown of scoring to be used for the overall champions in each division as well as the overall champions.
 - A. Interview Score Accounting for 20% of the total score.
 - 1. Each exhibitor will be interviewed on the overall selection, feeding, showing, yield grading, quality grading, etc. of their steer project. Exhibitors will be ranked/placed from highest to lowest interview scores.
 - B. Live Animal Show Placing Accounting for 30% of the total score.



- 1. Steers will be divided into and shown in weight classes (light, medium and/or heavy) classes as equally as possible. The steer judge will place individuals in their respective class as well as an overall ranking.
- C. Ultrasound Carcass Results Accounting for 50% of the total score.
 - All carcass data will be generated from ultrasound measurements taken by an Ultrasound Guidelines Council (UGC) certified ultrasound technician.
 - 2. **NO** animals will be harvested for carcass data collection; however, carcass data will be derived from the ultrasound measurements by initially ranking the steers using the USDA Yield Grade Equation: USDA YG = 2.5 + (2.5 x fat thickness + (0.2 x estimated %KPH Fat **(2.5%)**) (0.32 x ribeye area) + (0.0038 x hot carcass weight **(assume 62% of Live weight)**).
 - 3. The numerical yield grade derived from this formula will then be adjusted for ultrasonic ribeye area (REAU), ultrasonic fat thickness (FTU), hot carcass weight (HCW) and ultrasonic quality grade (%FATU) using the following adjustment factors for the final BEEF CARCASS INDEX (BCI) to determine Champion and Reserve Champion Beef Carcass. The lowest BCI animal will win.

- The overall champion and reserve champion will be determined by the lowest final score tabulated as follows: (exam score ranking X 0.20) + (live animal show ranking X 0.30) + (BCI ranking X 0.50). Tabulated final score ties will be broken by using the following values (listed in order of priority): PYG, QG, exam score and/or live animal ranking.
- Tail switch hair samples will be pulled from every steer exhibited for DNA validation of parentage. Animals failing to parent verify to the assigned pedigree will be disqualified from the show and the exhibitor must forfeit all awards.

NOTE

 For Junior Nationals, all steers will be required to be DNA tested, so keep in mind when buying steers for next year that both their parents and the steer itself need to have DNA test kits sent into the BBU office if they aren't already on file.

XIV. HALTERED BULL SHOW

- For the Bull to be eligible, he must be:
 - Born from March 31, 2013-September 1, 2011
 - Haltered & Broke to lead
 - Bred & Owned by the exhibitor
- Additional Rules:
 - Bulls of 12 months and older must have nose-restraint.
 - No Jr. Showman (10 or under on or before Dec. 31, 2012) exhibiting Sr. division bulls.
 - No bulls allowed for Showmanship. Only heifers will be exhibited in Showmanship.
 - If an exhibitor doesn't receive the 25 points from the Bred & Owned heifer show, that exhibitor may receive those points when he/she exhibits his/her Bred & Owned bull.

XV. ADVANCER HEIFER SHOW

ADVANCER HEIFER SHOW RULES

- 1. Heifers must be registered BBU Advancers to compete.
- 2. Exhibitors will abide by all JBBA rules for the Advancer Heifer Show
- 3. If you have a purebred Beefmaster female with an Advancer calf at side you will show in the Advancer Heifer Show Only.
- 4. All BBU registered animals, including Advancer Heifers, must be shown with their hair coats lying downward and flat against their entire body. Hair trimming is permissible and must be done in those few areas such as the neck and portions of the topline of the animal which may not lay flat against the body. Hair may not be trained upwards or forwards and/or pulled upwards or forwards on any part of the animal's body. No animals may have any foreign object(s) attached to it in any manner or have its natural color altered in a manner so as to change the conformation or appearance. An exhibitor who fails to abide by this rule will be dismissed from the arena and/or forfeit premiums, awards and points from the show.
- 5. All heifers, two (2) years and older on the day of the show must be palpated safe in calf by a licensed veterinarian and so state on the health certificate, with the exception of heifers nursing their BBU registered natural calf-at-side (under 6 months of age), in which case the heifer may show open. Heifers that do not show the day of month on their BBU Certificate of Breeding shall be considered to be born on the first day of that month.
- 6. If you have a Registered Advancer dam, (less than 87.5% Beefmaster) with a Certified, Registered Beefmaster Calf (87.5% Beefmaster or greater), the pair will show in the Advancer Heifer Show.
