OYSTER CRACKERS BY ANNETTE ROBBINS

2 pkgs oyster crackers
1 pkg Hidden Valley Ranch Dressing Mix
1 1/2 cup Wesson oil
1 1/2 tbsp crushed dill or dill weed
1 1/2 tsp lemon pepper

Put oyster crackers in large roaster pan. Mix remaining ingredients well. Then pour over crackers. Mix well. Put in 200 degree oven for one hour uncovered. Stir every 15 minutes. Let cool and put in airtight container

1 box yellow cake mix

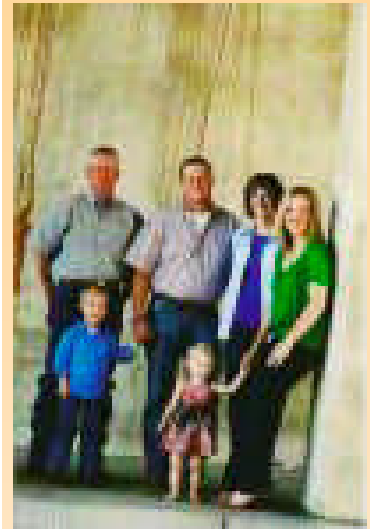


MEET THE MEMBERS

Lana Carpenter was born in western Oklahoma and raised on her father's ranch, a 720 acre Hereford cattle ranch west of Leedey, Oklahoma. She and her sister were happiest helping their dad work cattle and enjoyed barrel racing. After Leedey High School, she attended college at Northwestern State and at Oklahoma State University. Lana received a degree in Home Economics Education and taught Vocational Home Economics for twenty-nine years before retiring in 2003. It was while at OSU that she met a renegade bull rider, named Steve Carpenter, who was on the rodeo team. Lana states, "In 1975 after a whirlwind romance of about two years, one of us gave up the pursuit and we married." Lana taught at Asher High School while Steve finished his teaching degree and they soon moved to Steve's home town of Tecumseh, OK raising Quarter horses on his grandfather's land. During this time Steve trained and sold horses and Lana's job was to cool them down and wash them off. Lana remembers, "In our

spare time, we both taught school - he at Bethel Public School and me at Asher. But, our passion has always been ranch life." When their son Colby was born, Lana's dad gave him six Hereford cows including a bull and the Carpenters were in the cattle business. Steve had been riding cutting horses during this time, but when he became high school principal, he had no time so they sold all but two of their horses and kept the cattle. In 1990 they sold the Herefords, replaced them with Beefmasters and became members of BBU. Colby began showing Beefmaster heifers as a high school freshman and through JBBA, Colby showed cattle in Oklahoma, Texas, Louisiana, Mississippi, and Arkansas. Colby was a JBBA director and an officer, participated in all the Nationals' leadership contests and at one event he achieved Senior All-Around Champion. Lana states, "We all have fond memories and deep ties to JBBA. It has taught so many kids about friendship, teamwork, responsibility, and work ethic. Like

many others, our son benefited greatly from the scholarships provided through JBBA. Because Beefmaster Cattlewomen's sole purpose has been to help provide JBBA scholarships, I was proud to become a member and help give back to an organization that has given so much to our family." Lana has served on the Cattlewomen's Scholarship and Nomination Committees in the past and continues to "volunteer" when asked. Colby married Emily Torbert, in 2005, and became co-owner of the Tecumseh Vet Clinic in 2006. Lana and Steve now have two wonderful grandchildren - Cayden and Quinn. "We're hoping they, too, will be JBBA members and with Colby and Emily's permission, PawPaw and MaMaw will be more than willing to haul the grandkids and their cattle to JBBA shows!" Lana adds, "Steve and I have been impressed with the friendliness of everyone associated with BBU. I just wished we lived in Texas for many reasons, but especially so we could be closer to more BBU sales and functions!"
